WHEREAS, Pilgrim Pipeline is proposing a project to install two pipelines to convey petroleum material to and from a refinery in Linden, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, one pipeline will carry crude oil from a terminal in Albany, New York, to the refinery in Linden, New Jersey, and the other pipeline will carry refined finished product from the refinery back to Albany, New York; and

WHEREAS, the proposed right-of-way exists entirely within the New Jersey Highlands Preservation Area; and

WHEREAS, this pipeline would cause serious problems to the residents of Passaic County and the State of New Jersey, as oil and gas development can substantially reduce the value of real estate and land, while increasing the risk of leaks and explosions; and

WHEREAS, More than 10,000 pipeline incidents have occurred in the United States since 1993, including about 6,000 from petroleum pipelines; and

WHEREAS, one of the worst and most expensive oil spills in U.S. history came from a pipeline failure, such as the one in July 2010 near a tributary of Michigan's Kalamazoo River;

the proposed Pilgrim Pipeline Project because of the potential

degradation of New Jersey's drinking water supply and the

potential safety to our region and communities; and

Resolution to the Governor's Office, the State Legislature, the

State Land Conservancy Commission, with a letter of

opposition by the Freeholder Director on behalf of the Passaic
