WHEREAS, Pilgrim Pipeline Holdings is proposing to build two parallel oil pipelines through the County of Bergen that would transport crude oil and refined petroleum products between Albany, New York and Linden, New Jersey and, as proposed, passes through the boroughs of Oakland and Mahwah; and

WHEREAS, the proposed pipeline would pass through Bergen County park land and the Ramapo River Basin Aquifer system which provides 100% of the water for the boroughs of Mahwah, Oakland, Franklin Lakes, and Allendale; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders supports the safe transport of oil and the jobs created by infrastructure development, but has concerns with respect to the proposed pipeline including loss of habitat, potential for spill, contamination of ground and surface water, clean-up costs, and burden on emergency first responders; and

WHEREAS, the boroughs of Oakland and Mahwah have voiced their concerns and opposition to the proposed Pilgrim Pipeline.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Bergen voices their opposition to the Pilgrim Pipeline as proposed, and supports the concerns and oppositions of the town councils of Mahwah and Oakland; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Bergen does hereby join the NJ State Senate, State Assembly, and the 4 surrounding counties in calling for a full environmental review of the project and calls on the United States Army Corps of Engineers to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement for the entire route of the project, and calls upon the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to conduct a thorough environmental review of the project, including a Highlands Act review; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Office of Governor Chris Christie, Senators Robert Menendez and Cory Booker, Congressmen Scott Garrett, Bill Pascrell, and Albio Sires, the Bergen county representatives to the New Jersey State Senate and Assembly, and the municipalities of Bergen County.
